Makos Review Lesson 64 - DAF 13B:

R' Yishmael's Reason:

- 1. **Question:** What is R. Yishmael's reason? (We are thinking that he obligates lashes for Chayavei Misos, even when the transgressor will be killed.)
- 2. **Answer:** "Im Lo Sishmor La'asos Es Kol Divrei ha'Torah... v'Hifla Hash-m Es Makoscha";
- 3. **Question:** What does Hafla'ah refer to?
- 4. Answer: It refers to lashes "v'Hipilu ha'Shofet v'Hikahu."
- 5. **Question #1:** We should learn from "Im Lo Sishmor La'asos" that one is lashed for not fulfilling an Aseh!
- 6. **Answer:** "Im Lo Sishmor" connotes a Lav; as we see from...
- 7. R. Avin: Wherever it says 'Hishamer', 'Pen' or 'Al', this is a Lav.
- 8. **Question #2:** We should learn that one is lashed for a Lav she Ein Bo Ma'aseh (without an action)!
- 9. Answer: It says "La'asos."
- 10. **Question #3:** We should say that one is lashed for a Lav she'Nitak l'Aseh (there is an Aseh to 'fix' transgressing the Lav)!
- 11. Answer (and Answer to questions #1 & #2): Lashes are for transgressions like muzzling an animal (which it written next to the Parshah of lashes), which is not Nitak l'Aseh.

R' Akiva's Reason:

- 1. Question: What is R. Akiva's reason?
- 2. **Answer #1:** "Kedei Rish'aso" one receives only one punishment for his evil;
- 3. **R. Yishmael** says, this teaches that one who is lashed or killed does not *pay*, but it does not apply to lashes and Misah, for this is like a protracted death (i.e. one punishment).
- 4. **Question:** R. Akiva should exempt also Chayavei Kerisus from lashes due to "Kedei Rish'aso"! Granted, if they will do Teshuvah, Hash-m will pardon them from Kares. However, if we lash them before they do Teshuvah, this is a second punishment!
